



WHEELS ON TRAILS



WHEELCHAIR + STROLLER-FRIENDLY TRAILS AND PATHS IN FLATHEAD VALLEY

BIGFORK NATURE TRAIL

This 4 mile out-and-back trail is level with gravel surface following along the Swan River. You can access the trail at the east end of Grand Avenue in Bigfork. (bigfork.org/glacier-national-park/nature-trails-and-hikes/)

FISH TRAILS

12 miles of paved pedestrian/bike paths around Whitefish. A segment of the trail runs along the river between various parks and extends all the way to City Beach. (glaciencyclery.com/area-trails/)

GREAT NORTHERN HISTORICAL TRAIL

Includes 22 miles of paved trail around Kalispell following part of the old Great Northern Railway route. Trailheads are located in Somers and Kila. (trailink.com/trail/great-northern-historical-trail/)

KRAUSE BASIN INTERPRETIVE TRAIL

The 0.25 mile loop trail is located 2.8 miles up Strawberry Lake Road #5390 from Foothill Road. The trail has a compacted gravel surface. (swanview.org/info/krause-basin-interpretive-trail/)

LONE PINE OVERLOOK

Located within Lone Pine State Park beginning at the visitor center, this 0.3 mile loop is an ADA accessible self-guided nature trail with scenic overlook. (fwp.mt.gov/stateparks/lone-pine)

PINE GROVE POND

The 5 acre pond is 3 miles northeast of Kalispell off Rose Crossing and is open Apr-Sept. The pond has a paved walking trail around it, ADA accessible fishing pier, picnic shelter, parking and vault latrine. (myfwp.mt.gov/fishMT/waterbody/16555545)

RESERVOIR TRAILHEAD

This 500 ft. ADA accessible interpretive trail loop is located close to downtown Whitefish with facilities include parking, vault toilet, and picnic area. (whitefishlegacy.org/trailheads/)

RIVERS EDGE PARK

Located along the bank of the Flathead River just 1/2 mile from downtown Columbia Falls, this community park includes ADA accessible bathroom and parking, as well as paved, primitive and boardwalk paths. (cityofcolumbiafalls.org/recreation)

SWIFT CREEK OVERLOOK

Located at the head of Whitefish Lake, Swift Creek Trailhead has ADA accessible facilities including parking, vault toilet, and 0.5 mile of ADA accessible trail leading to an overlook. (whitefishlegacy.org/trailheads/)

TRAIL OF THE CEDARS

Located in Glacier National Park, this 0.7 mile ADA accessible trail winds through old growth cedars starting at the Avalanche Picnic Area. Trail surface is wood boardwalk and pavement. (nps.gov/glac/planyourvisit/physical-mobility.htm)

Other area parks with paved pathways: Kalispell Parkline Linear Park & Trail, Kalispell Kids Sports Complex, Lawrence Park, Woodland Park, Smith Fields, Polson Interpretive Trail
