Service Area: Flathead, Lincoln, Lake, Sanders and Glacier counties (primarily) but will work with any patient seeing the providers in the Maternal Fetal Medicine or Midwives clinics

Clients/Customers/Patients: As a Maternal Care Coordinator, I work with patients of our Logan Health Maternal Fetal Medicine and Midwives clinics to evaluate and connect them with necessary resources to meet their social determinants of health (SDOH) needs (in areas such as housing, food stability, medical coverage, child care, mental health and substance use and parenting). Once SDOH needs have been identified, I refer patients to community resources to assist them in meeting those needs. I continue to follow that patient, as needed, through prenatal care and into the postpartum period to ensure all needs are met.

Service Description: As mentioned above, I work with patients to ensure all resource needs are met. I follow that patient through prenatal care and into the postpartum period as long as needed to ensure all needs are met. The purpose of my work is to increase the likelihood of healthy pregnancies and babies. I like that I get to work with patients on non-medical needs since those needs have been shown to impact medical care and pregnancy and child outcomes. It is rewarding to help a family get the support they need to welcome new babies into their lives and feel they have the support of their community to raise their family.

How I came to this work I have spent my career in various human services organizations and spent most of the time working with families who have children with developmental disabilities and delays. I have also spent time as a caseworker with Child Protective Services in Washington and worked for a few years with a Child Care Resource and Referral Agency in Kalispell before coming to work for Logan Health. I cannot say that I initially intended to end up in this position but this is the way life took me and I am thankful that I get the opportunity to make an impact on the lives of women, children and families in our community.

Clients/Customers/Patients: Our Parents as Teachers home visiting program serves families with children prenatal-5 years old. This is a free, voluntary program to support and partner with families to ensure that children are thriving and ready for school. We bring activities to promote parent-child interactions, development information and assessments, and work to support family well-being. We work with young parents, struggling families, and families that just need extra support and information on parenting as well as grandparents and foster parents who are raising young children.

Service Description: Our Parents as Teachers program is free for anyone in the community who may need some extra support in parenting (Prenatal-5 years old). We serve the families in their homes by providing development information, parenting topics, new books, and we bring activities that promote parent-child interactions. We offer developmental assessments to evaluate children's milestones from prenatal-5 years old and make referrals for children and families as needed. We offer mental health assessments as well and assist families by connecting them to resources for various needs. The child is the enrolled participant but we work with the whole family. We offer "Group Connections" which are events for families to come together as a group and participate in fun and creative activities and get to know other families with young children.

I enjoy working with families in our community so much. Making a deep and lasting connection with children and their families is a privilege. Watching children meet milestones, making progress with a difficult situation, or just to see the beauty in a parent and child playing on the floor together or reading a book. Parenting is hard! I love being able to encourage and support parents and caregivers and to help families to work together and thrive. I so enjoy that this work allows for a real connection with families as many stay with our program for years.

How I came to this work My work in social work was all as a medical social worker working in hospitals, nursing homes and with hospice until I found my current position. I had no idea this type of program existed or how much county health departments provide for their communities! It was a welcome surprise and I enjoy my work very much.
