is not eligible for assistance, even though monthly child care costs \$758 - 975 per child, on average. \$68,000 would see their monthly cost capped at 450 per month.

An estimated **30,563** children currently live in families between the **current** and the **proposed** eligibility.

The estimated annual cost of this expansion: \$17 million

- Under current eligibility, a family of three earning \$48000
- Under proposed eligibility, the same family of three earning
- An estimated **2374** children newly eligible children would enroll.

The **True Cost of Care** is upwards of \$23,000 - more than twice what most families struggle to pay currently.

Other states are working to establish wage programs to stabilize the industry and reduce turnover: MN, IL, NM

- **13% of MT child care workers live in poverty** (compared to 7%)
- More equitable pay was the top desired benefit among child


